FY25 Q1 RMA ENROLLMENT REPORT

Updated as of *JANUARY 2025*

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INTRODUCTION & CONTEXT

The **Refugee Medical Assistance (RMA)** program is a critical component of the resettlement process, offering essential medical coverage to ORR-eligible populations during their initial 12-month eligibility period. This report provides an analysis of enrollment data for Quarter 1 of fiscal year 2025 (October 1, 2024, to December 31, 2024) in the state of Texas.

During this quarter, a total of **7,024 individuals** were enrolled in the RMA program, representing diverse immigration statuses, including refugees, Cuban or Haitian entrants, asylees, and Ukrainian Humanitarian Parolees, Special Immigrant Visa (SIV) holders, and Victims of Trafficking (VoT). Enrollments were facilitated by a robust network of resettlement agencies across the state, including major metropolitan areas such as **Houston, Dallas-Fort Worth, Austin, and San Antonio**, as well as agencies in **Abilene, the Rio Grande Valley, El Paso, and the Texas Panhandle**.

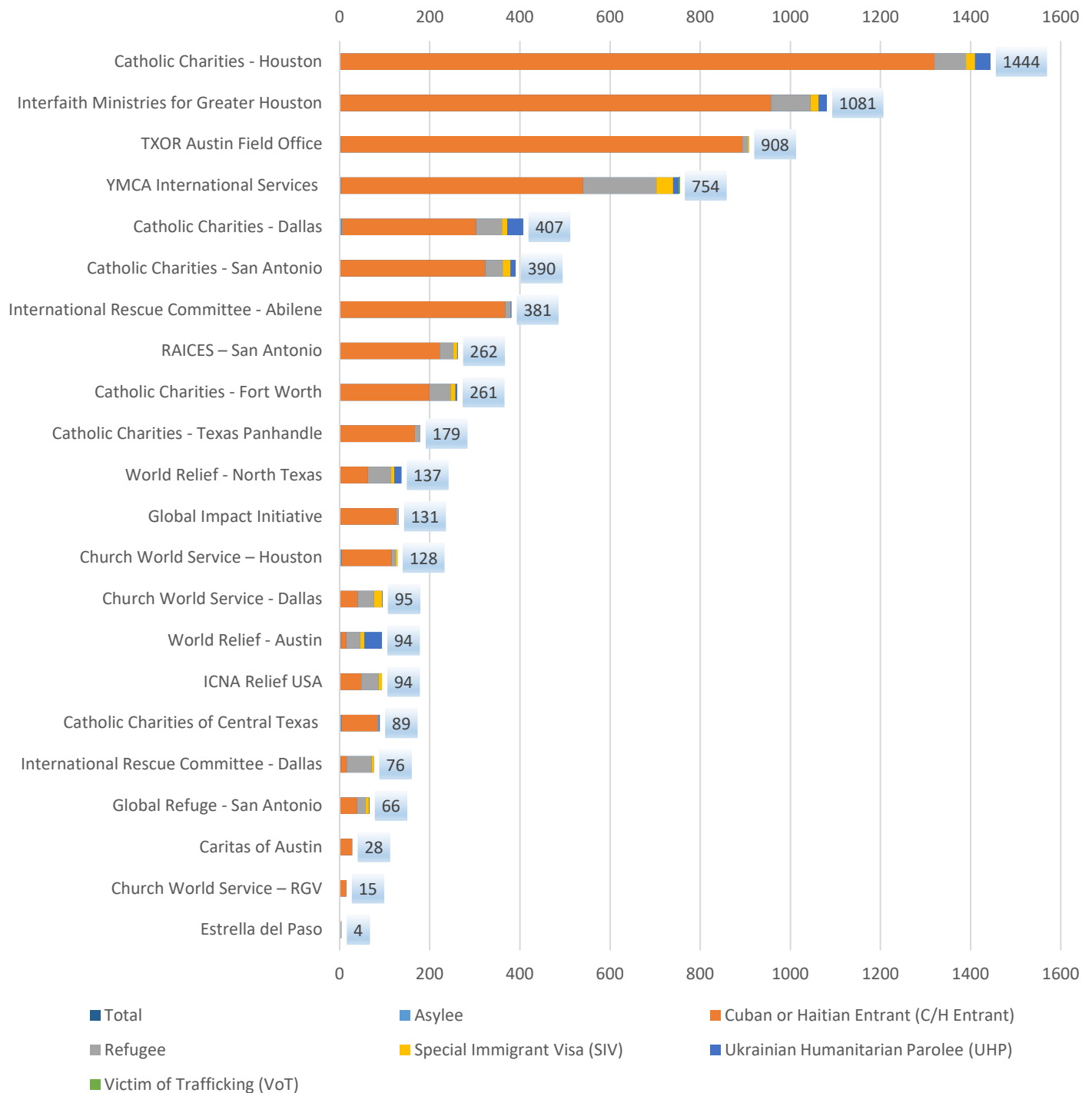
Key findings in this report reveal significant trends:

1. **Cuban or Haitian Entrants** represented the largest group, with **5,855 enrollees (83.4%** of total enrollment).
2. Geographic distribution showed that **Houston-Galveston** had the highest concentration of enrollees, with **3,407 individuals**, followed by **Dallas-Fort Worth** with **1,070 enrollees**, and **Austin** with **1,250 enrollees**.
3. Demographically, the most represented age group was **ages 19–29**, accounting for **2,514 enrollees (35.8%)**, followed by the **30–39 age group** with **2,015 enrollees (28.7%)**.
4. Gender distribution was **55.5% male (3,900 individuals)** and **44.5% female (3,124 individuals)**, reflecting a relatively balanced gender ratio among enrollees.
5. Among other immigration statuses, **refugees** comprised **780 enrollees (11.1%)**, while **Ukrainian Humanitarian Parolees (UHP)** accounted for **175 individuals (2.5%)**.

This report aims to provide insights into enrollment patterns and inform strategic decisions regarding resource allocation and program planning. The subsequent sections delve into detailed data visualizations and demographic analyses to support this goal.

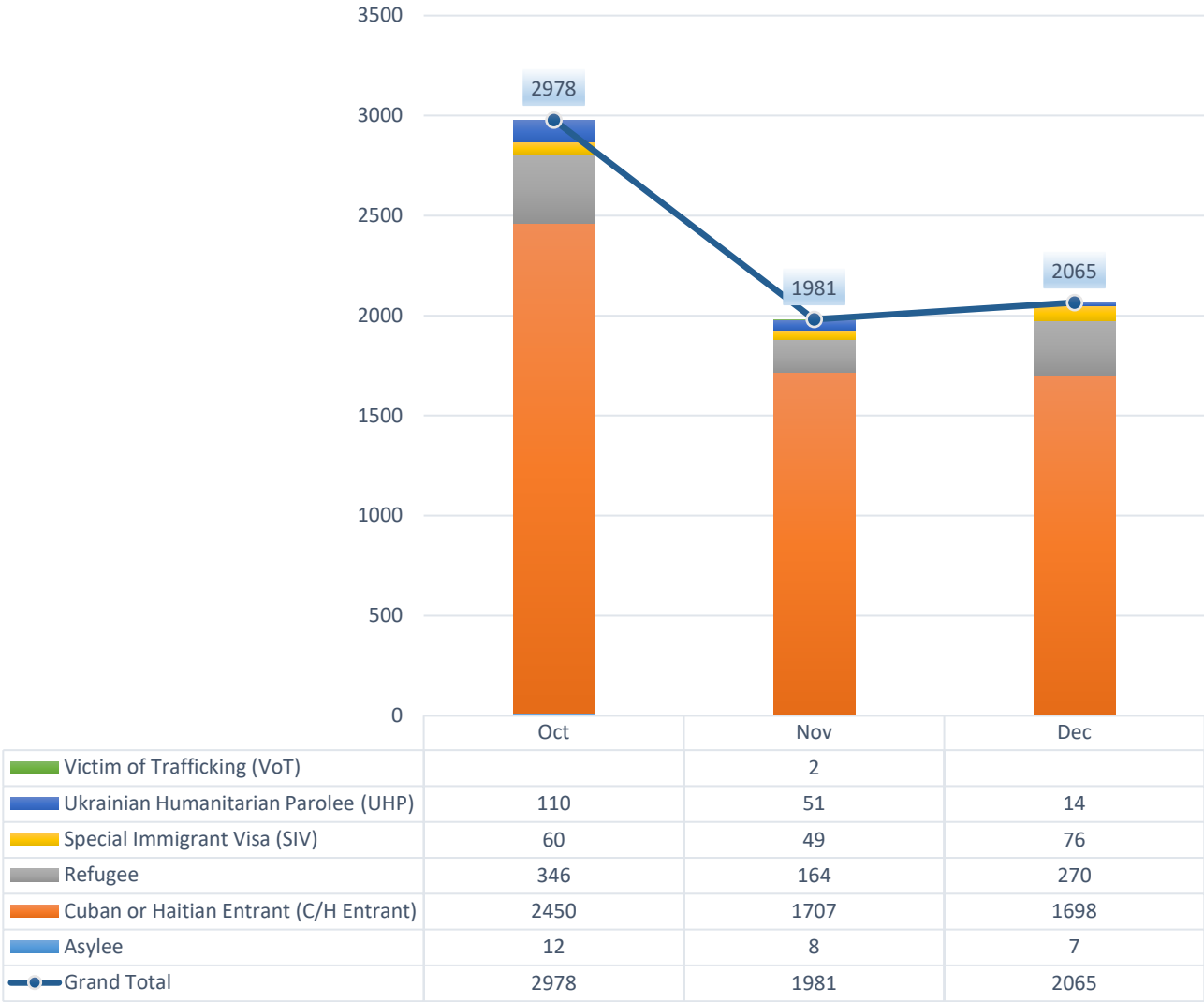

Enrollment by Agency and Immigration Status (Figure 1)



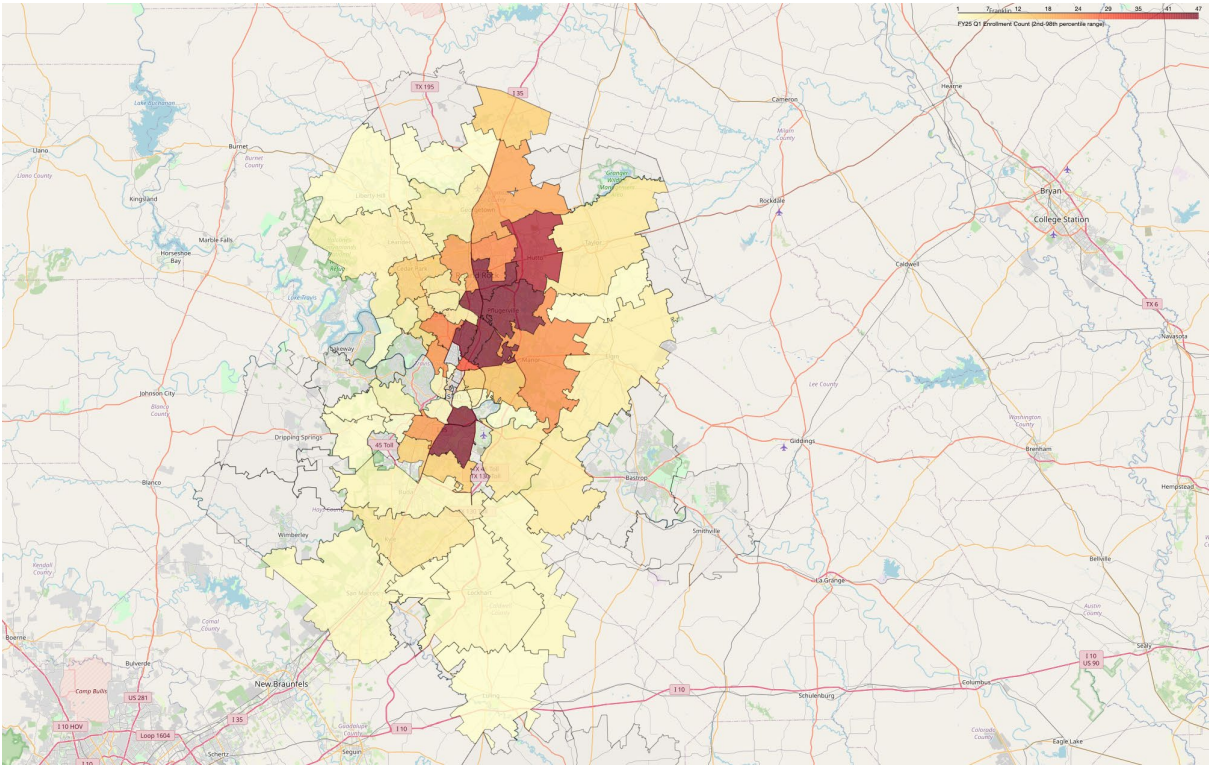
Q1 Enrollment by Month

FY2025 Q1 Monthly Enrollment

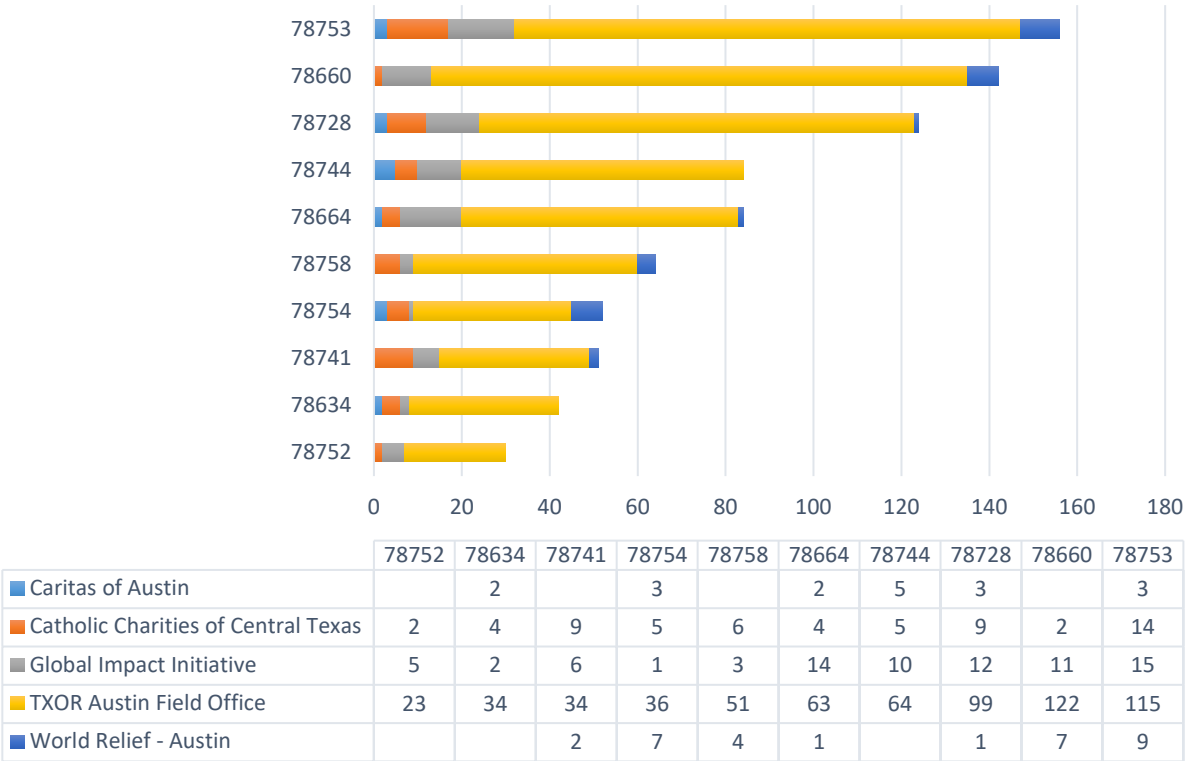


Enrollment Distribution for Top 4 Metro Areas

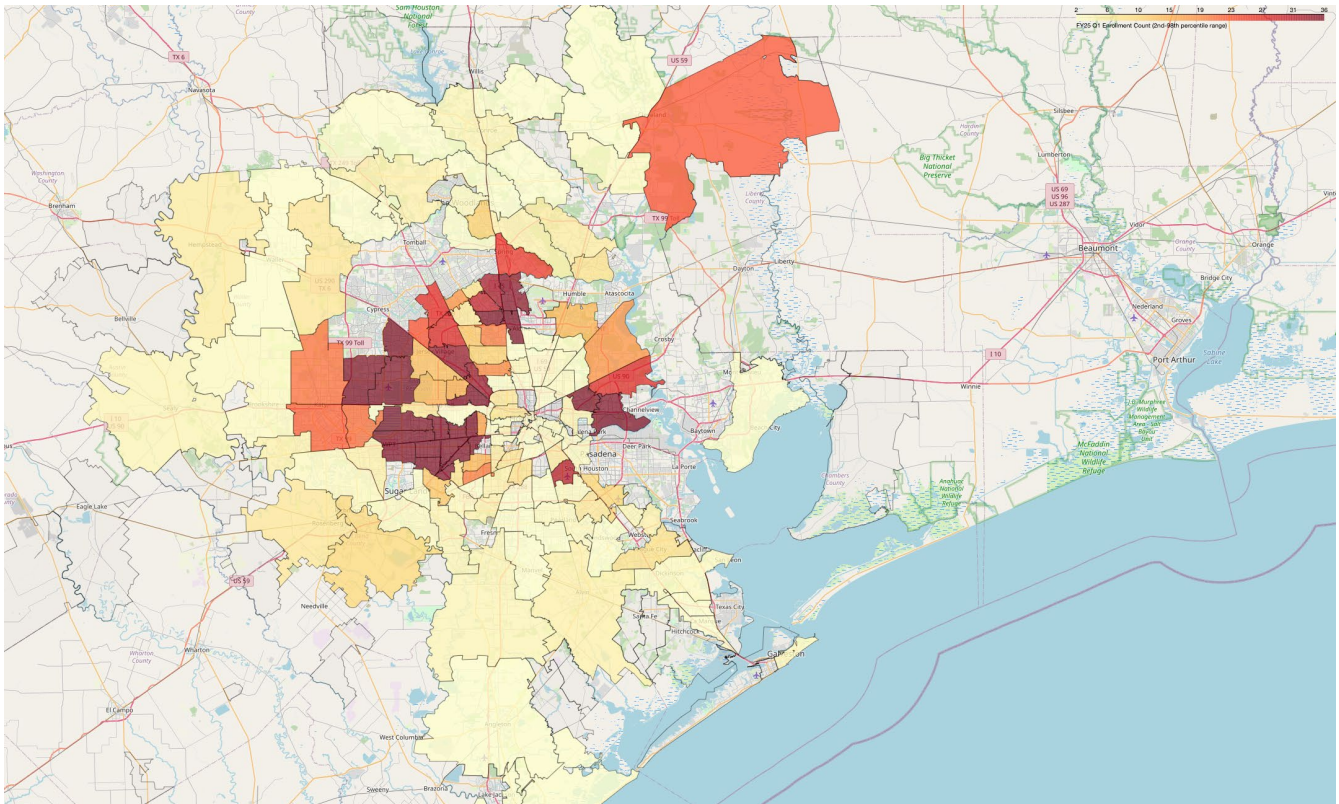

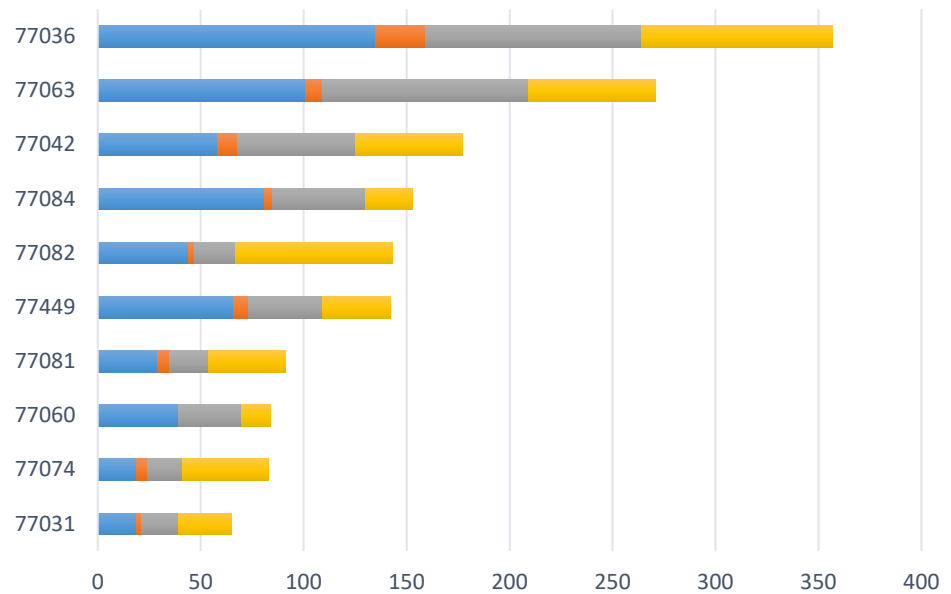
Top 10 Zip Codes



Houston-Galveston

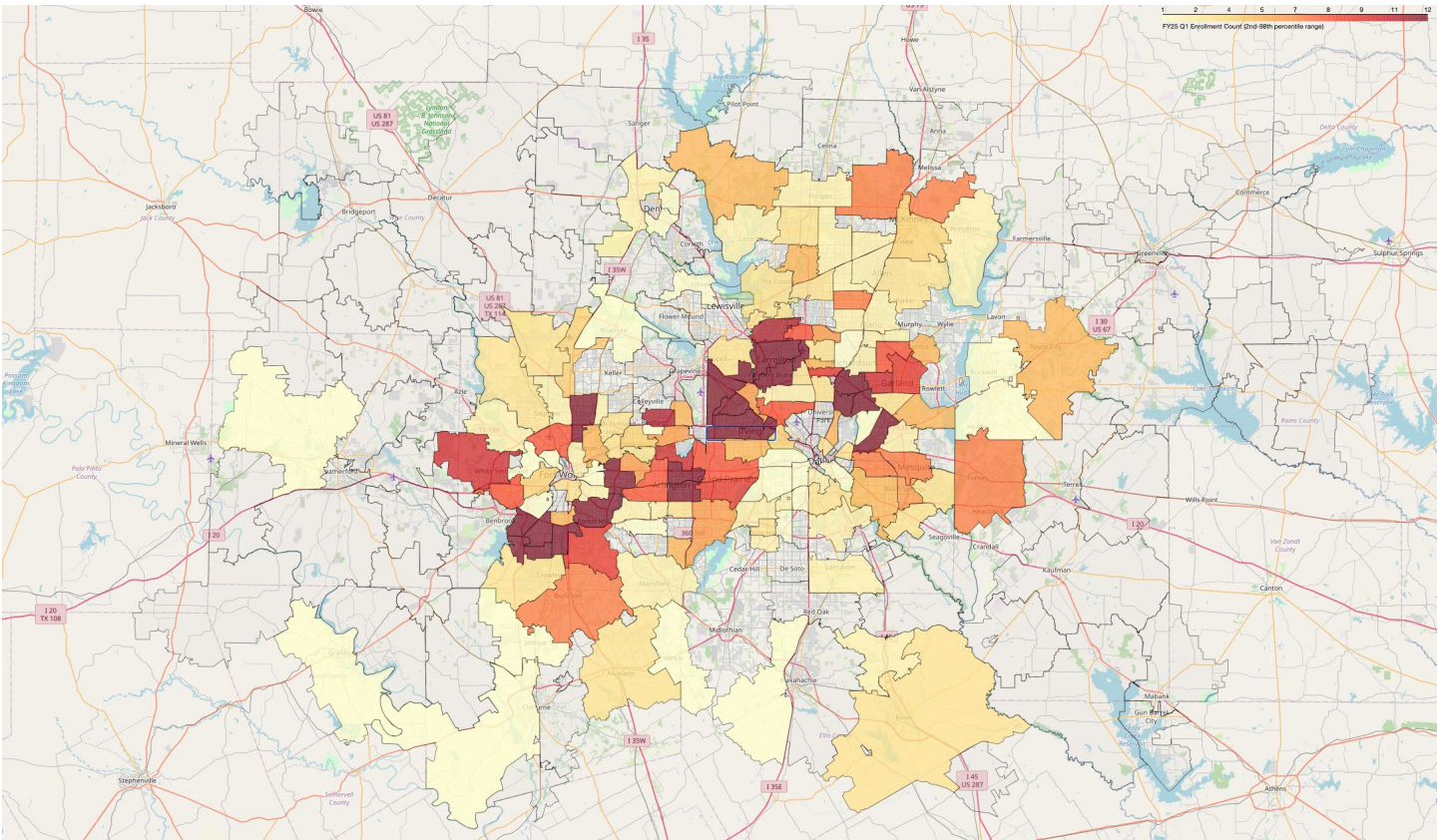

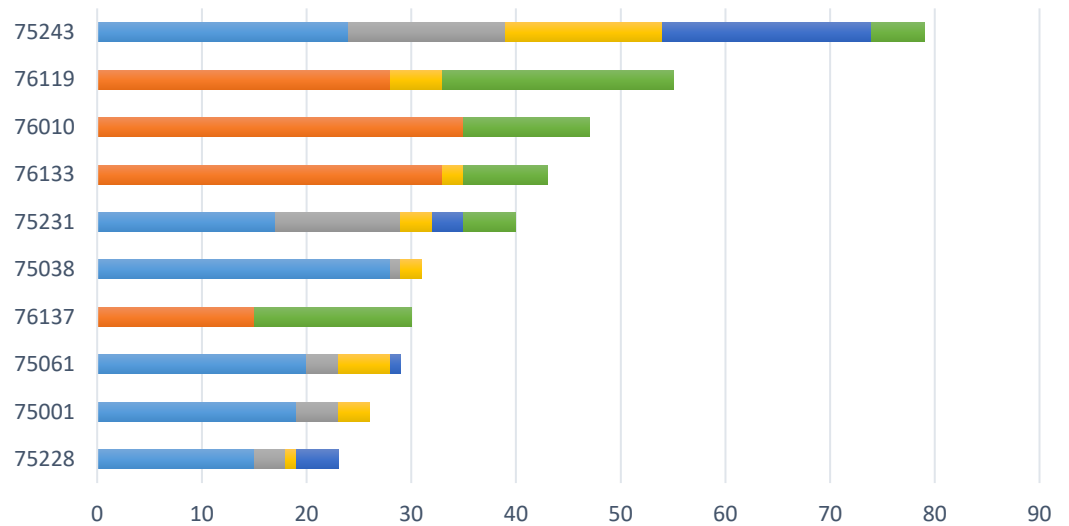

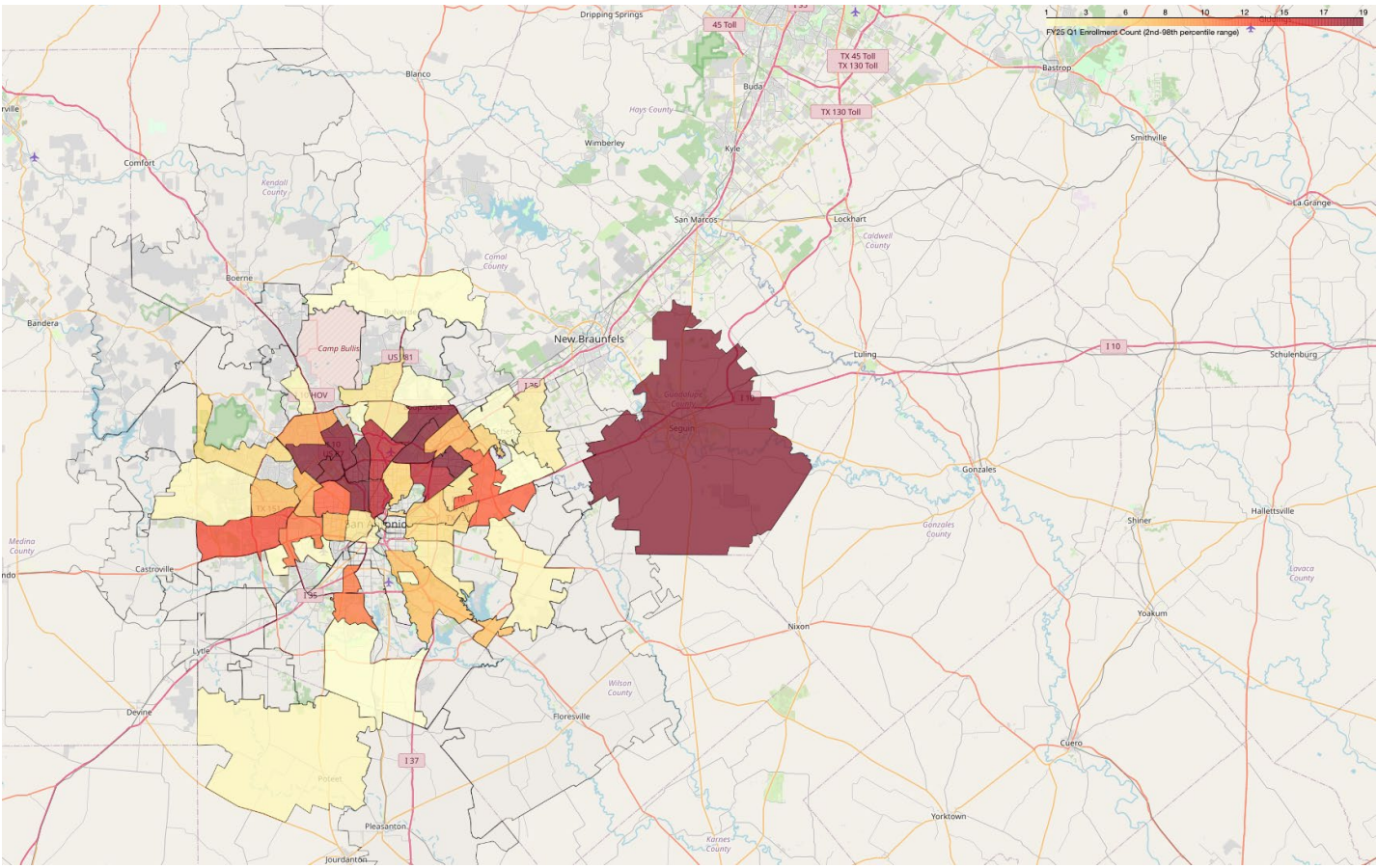

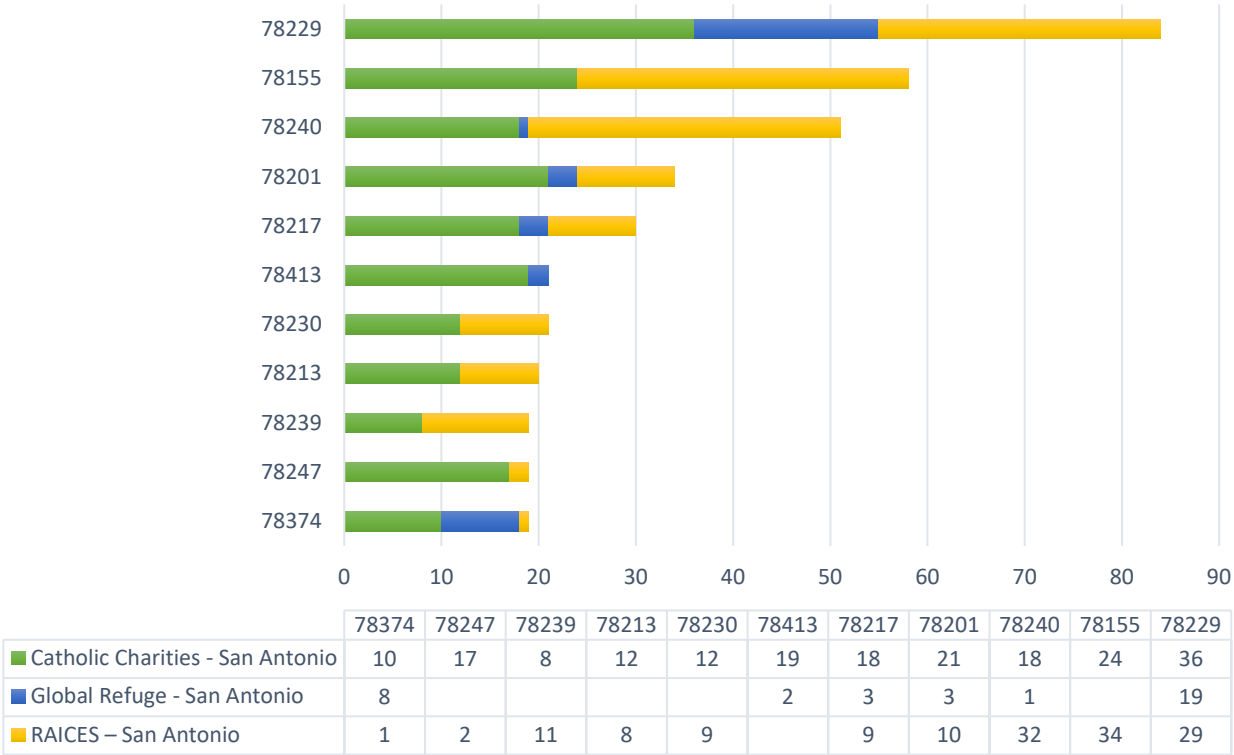

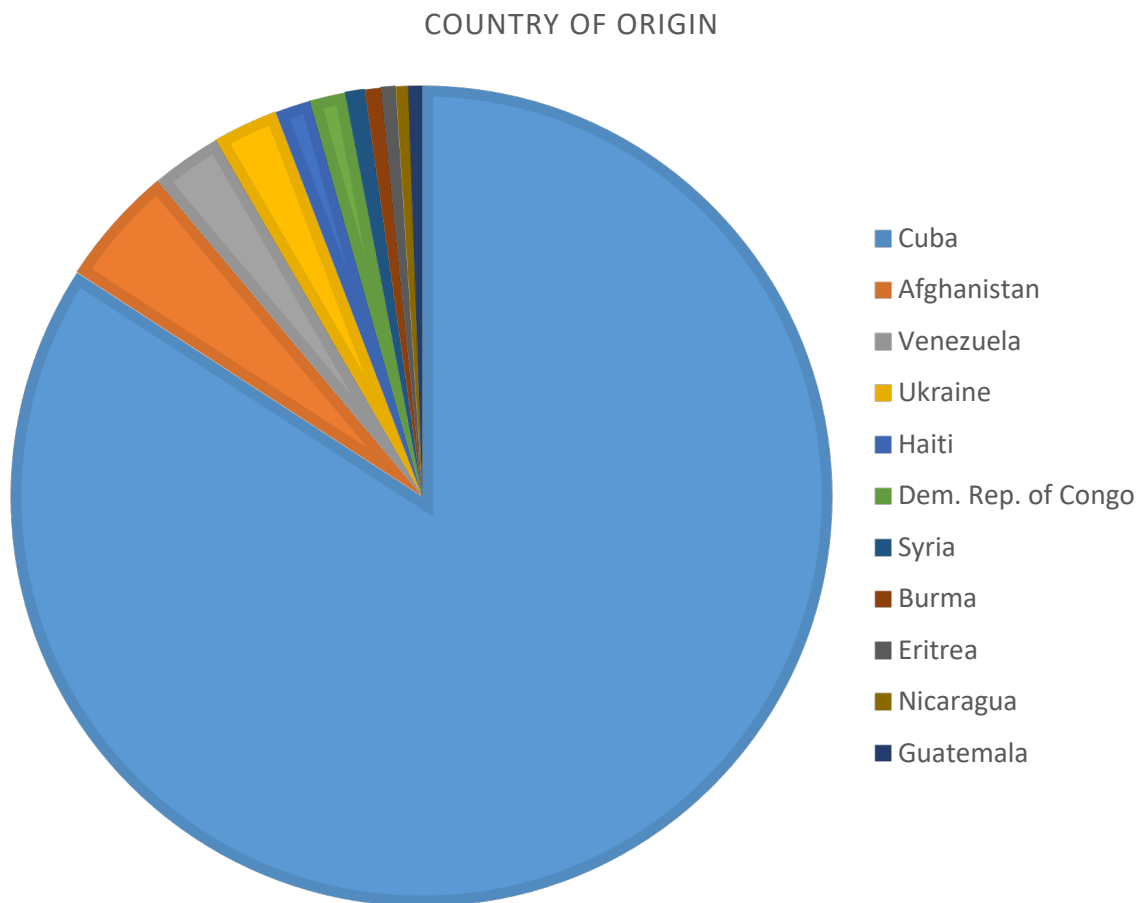

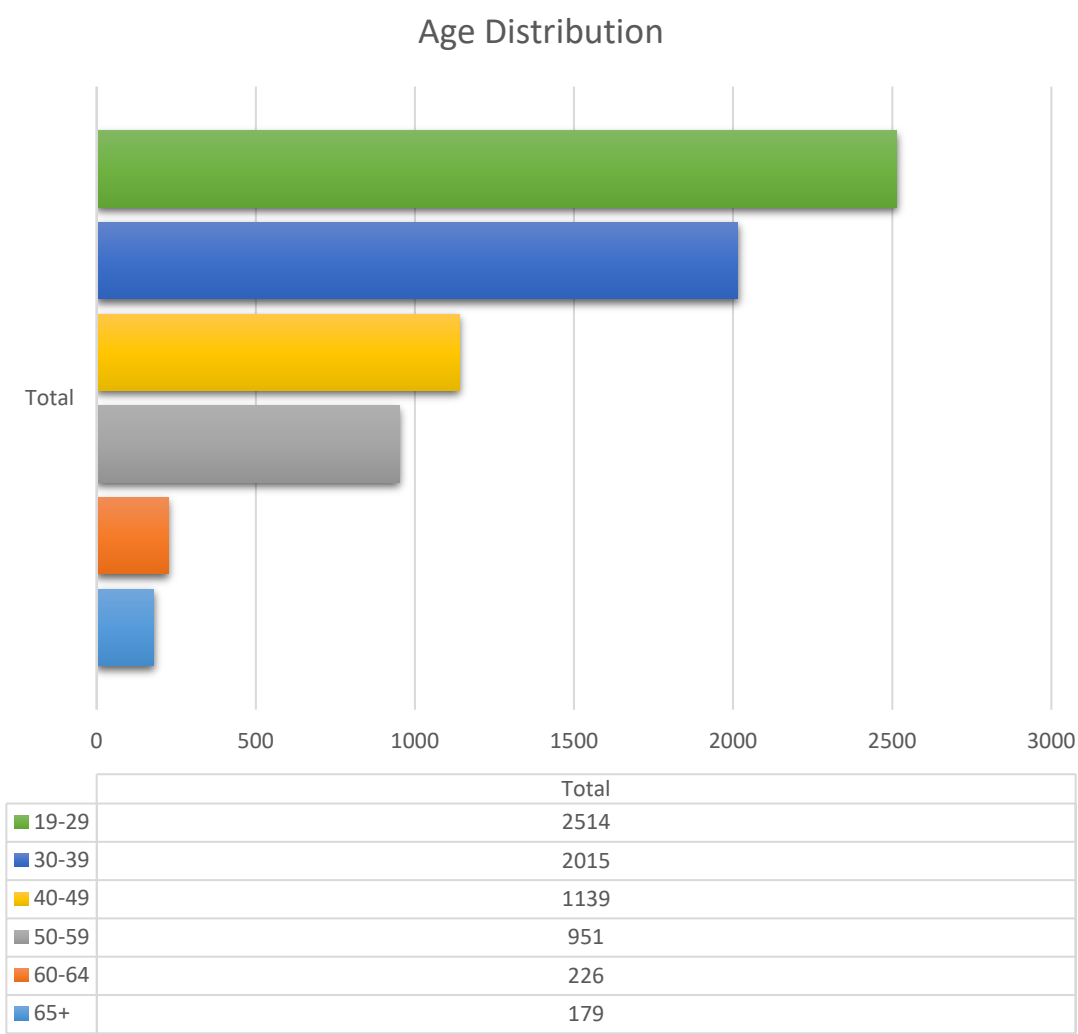

Enrollment by Country of Origin (Top 10)

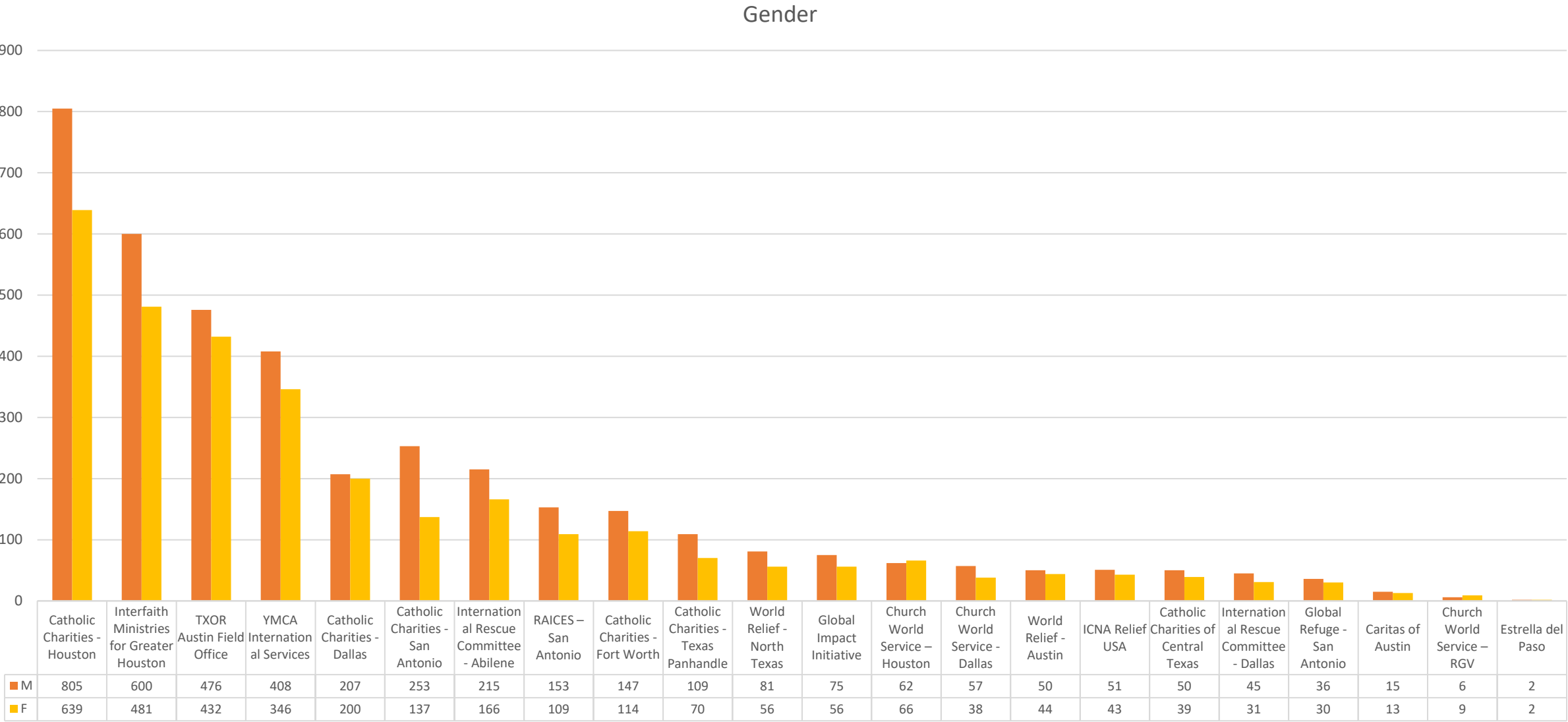

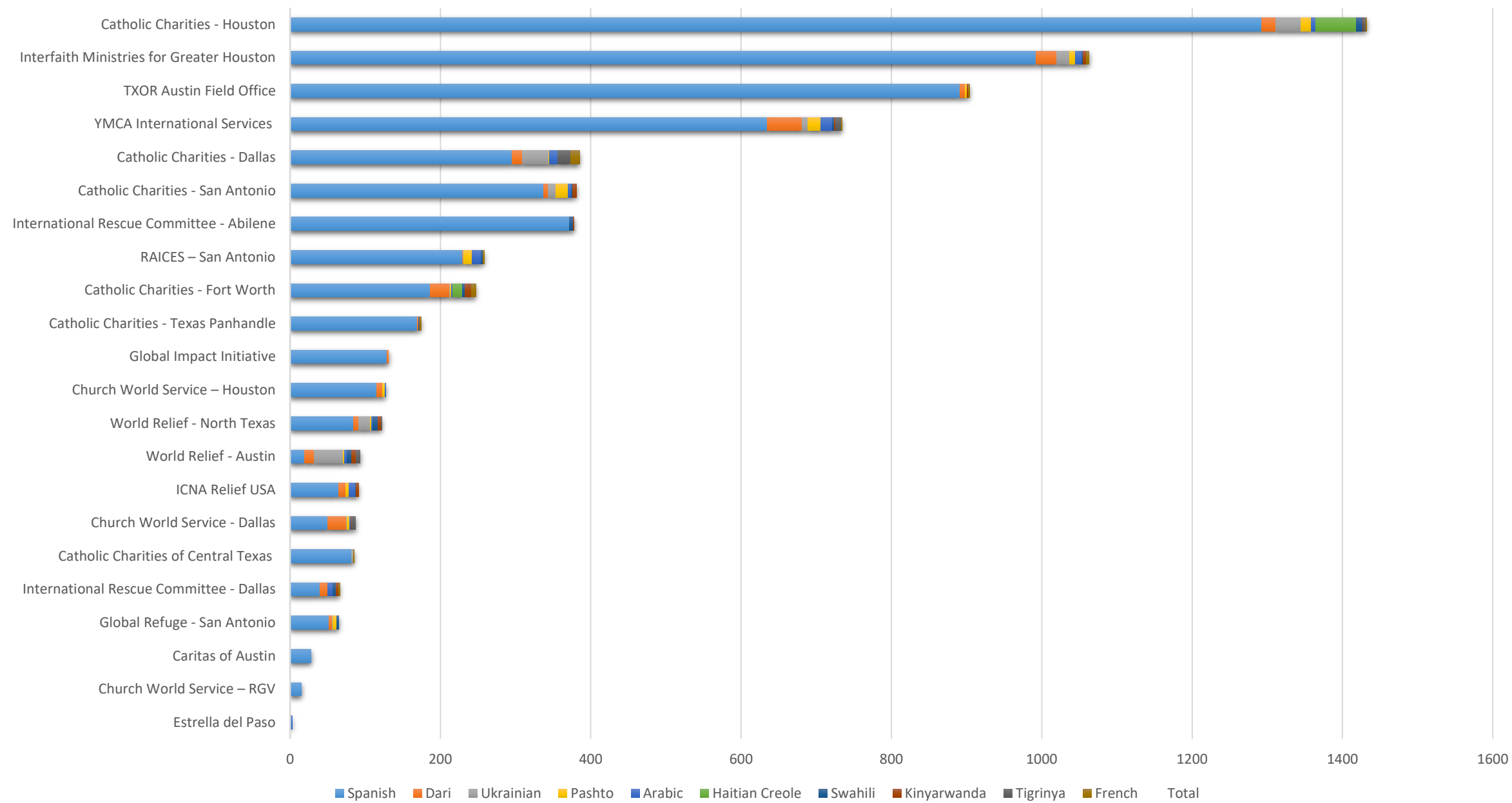
Enrollment by Age Group



Enrollment by Gender



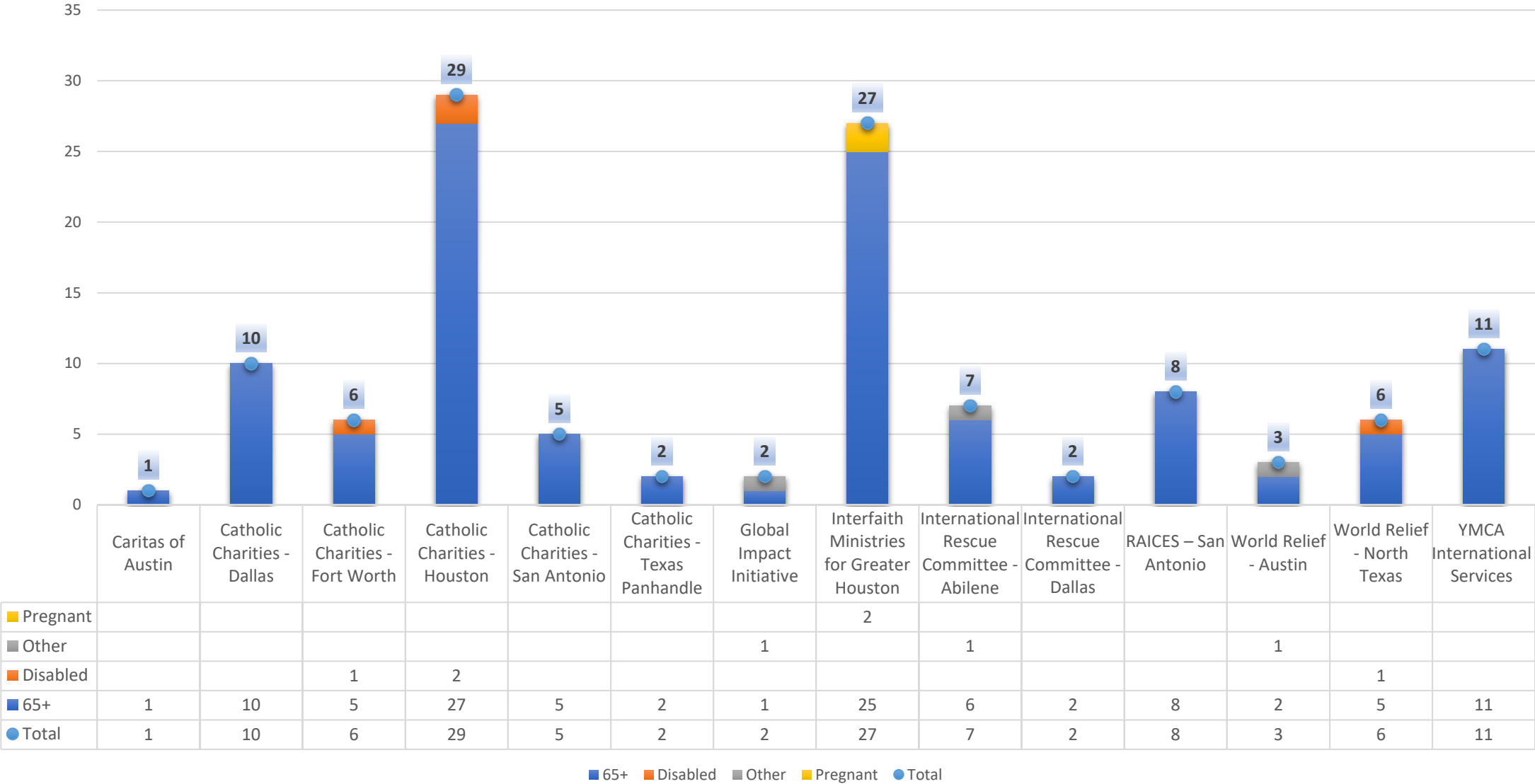
Enrollment by Preferred Language (Figure 2)

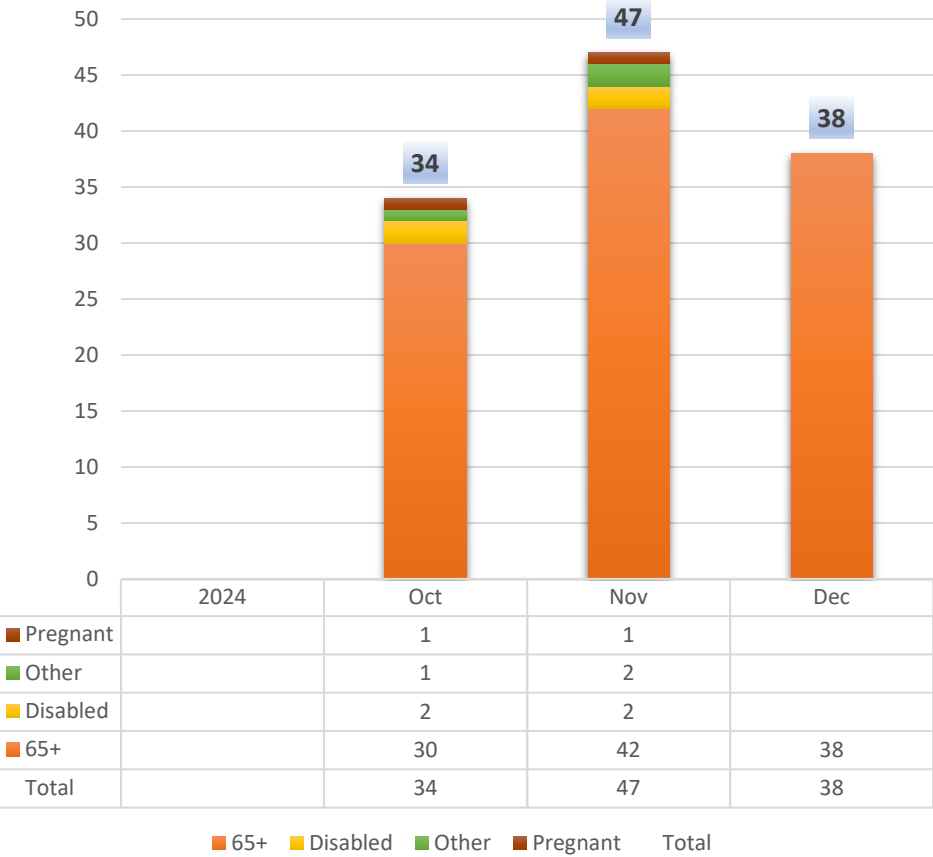
Conditional Enrollment by Agency

Q1 Conditional Enrollment by Agency

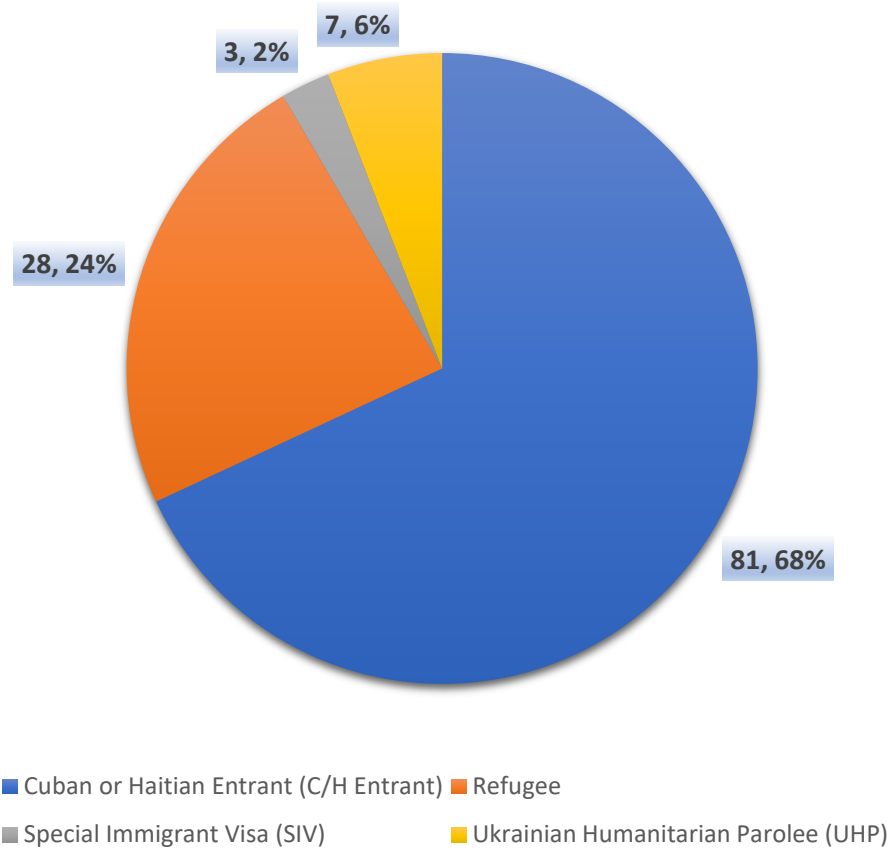


Q1 Total Conditional Enrollment by Month and Immigration Status

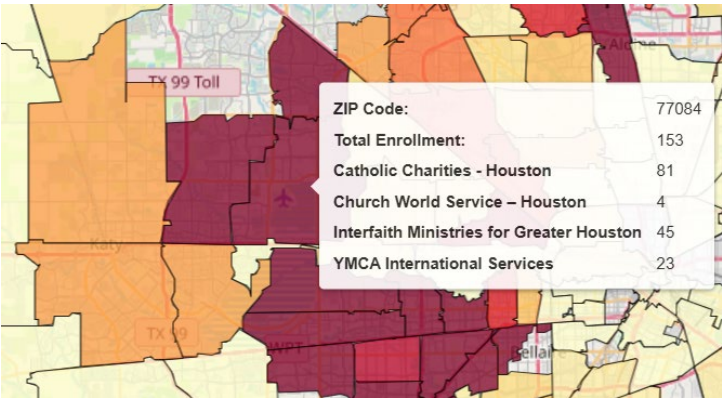
